What is the environment like in the home?

Newark Care is a 61 bedded care home, all with en-suite facilities. It is split into four units so nowhere appears too large. The care home is fortunate to have a large and gorgeous garden.

The home is custom designed and built to meet the needs of older people, with large comfortable lounge areas to relax in and to socialise with others with ease.

All surroundings are of high quality and there are outdoor areas and gardens to take in the fresh air and enjoy the seasons.

Our rooms

We try to make our rooms as homely as we can, and where possible encourage residents to bring some personal items to remind them of home. Our rooms have en-suite facilities and a nurse call system.





Activities

Our teams listen to the needs of each resident to ensure that they always content and comfortable. Our team of activities coordinator organises a weekly schedule of pastimes and entertainment to keep life fun and engaging for our residents.

Newark is a huge part of the local community.

We look forward to resuming the many activities our residents enjoyed before Covid-19. Residents regularly visited nearby homes for tea and we returned the favour. We enjoyed seeing shows at the Beacon Arts Centre, and welcomed guests from local schools, churches and nurseries.

Newark was also the pilot care home for Morton in the Community. Young people from this group visited Newark weekly to play bowls, Pictionary, walking football and also to reminisce and socialise. Thanks to the success of the pilot, Morton in the Community was allocated funding to continue their work across the local authority.

Simple pleasures, such as reading the morning newspaper or going for a walk, can be just as important for residents. Whether you enjoy flower arranging, painting, or a game of cards there is always something to do and somewhere to socialise.

We encourage participation in a range of daily activities while remaining respectful and reflective of the overall wellbeing and interests of each person living with us.

Food

We take it to heart that good food can be a highlight of the day. Our Chef take great pride in creating enjoyable and nutritionally balanced meals. We take time to understand your food preferences, and where required provide assistance with eating.

There's always a choice on the menu.

We provide three meals a day, with snacks in between, and do everything we can to cater for individual likes and tastes.

We maintain good levels of hydration and nutrition, particularly amongst our residents with memory loss.
